



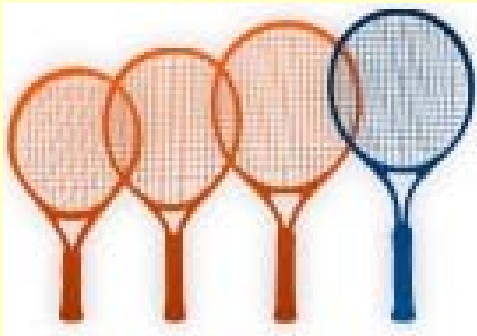

What is it?

10 and Under Tennis using the QuickStart Tennis play format takes a new and better approach to introducing kids to the game. Balls are lower in compression; they bounce lower and don't move as fast so they are easier to hit. This allows kids time to get to the ball and helps them develop optimal swing patterns. Racquets are sized for small hands, and the courts are smaller and easier to cover. All that equals more fun and less frustration. Full sized courts can be reconfigured to accommodate up to six 36-foot courts, so instead of waiting in line, kids can spend their time playing.

With 10 and Under Tennis using the QuickStart Tennis play format, the math is simple: more happy kids = increased revenue for clubs and teaching pros. Multiple court configurations allow for as many as four to six courts in the space of a standard single court. Get Facility Assistance to Modify Existing Tennis Courts, Blacktops & Other Playing Surfaces

USTA Mid-Atlantic has pledged to line 150 courts on a "first come, first served" basis. To take advantage of this offer apply for a 2011 USTA Public Facility Category I Assistance Program Grant (Two (2) Court maximum grant which requires a 50% local match) by filing out a *Facility Assistance Form*

<http://ct.usta.com/pfa/>. USTA Mid-Atlantic will match dollar for dollar the investment USTA National makes toward the total cost of lining two (2) courts to make up the required 50% local match. Available USTA Mid-Atlantic funds will be capped at two courts per facility. Currently, the cost to line QuickStart courts is approximately \$250-\$450 per court. Jr. Team Tennis - 8U & 10U

USTA Jr. Team Tennis is designed for kids ages 5-18. They are immediately placed on teams. All you need to start a league are two teams. Matches can be held anywhere from a local park or school to a commercial or private club. Teams are preferably co-ed but can also be single gender (boys only or girls only).

Modified scoring, 36' and 60' courts, foam & low compression balls are used for 8U and 10U JTT.

New for 2011

USTA Mid-Atlantic now requires that all 8U sanctioned tournament play and USTA Jr. Team Tennis (JTT) must take place on 36 foot courts. Effective September 1, 2010 all USTA Jr. Team Tennis (JTT) 10 and under beginner and intermediate play must take place on 60 foot courts using the orange ball. In 2012 all 10U sanctioned tournament play (effective 1/1/2012) must take place on 60 foot courts with the exception of a few elite events on 78 ft court using the green ball.
